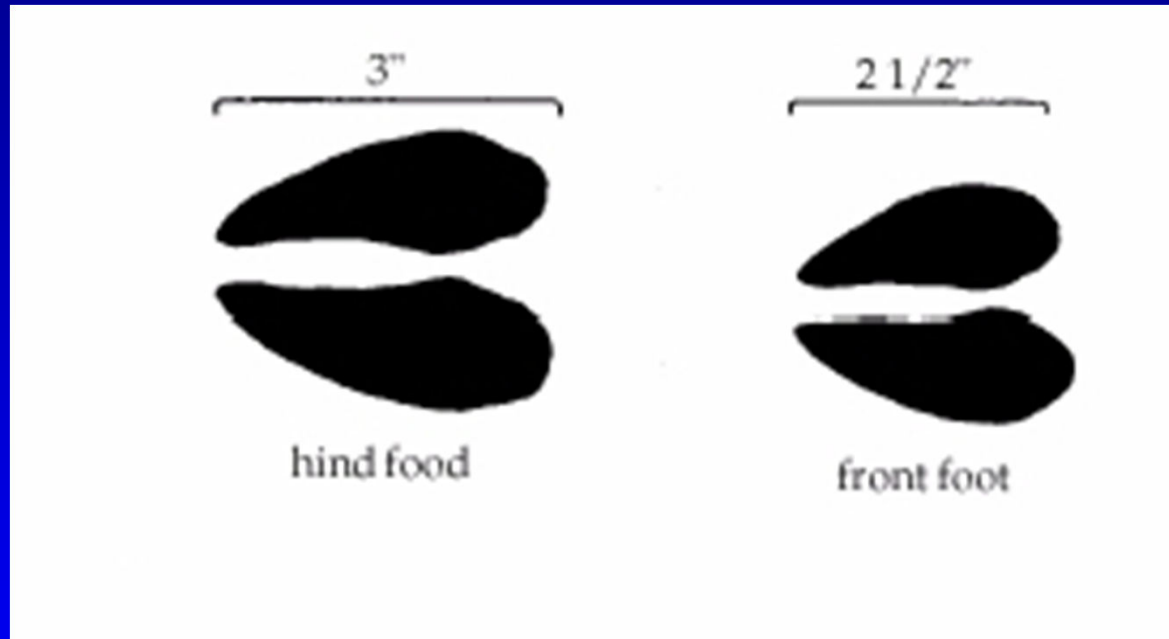

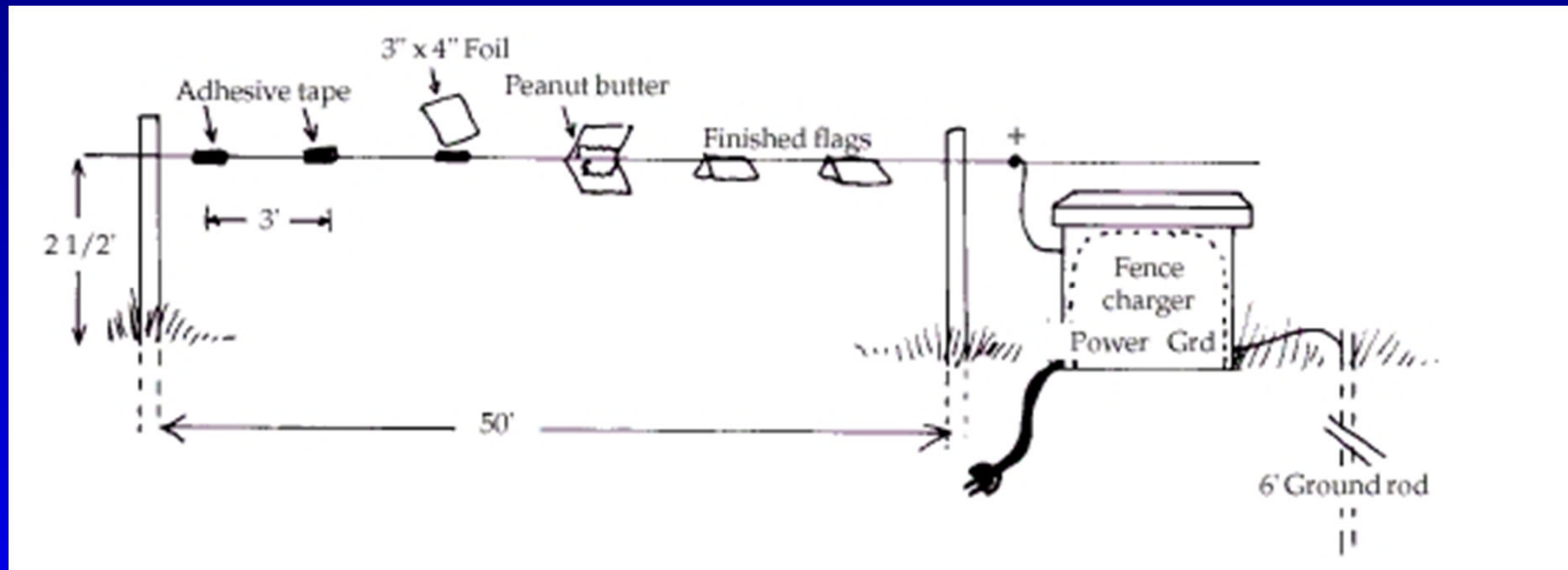

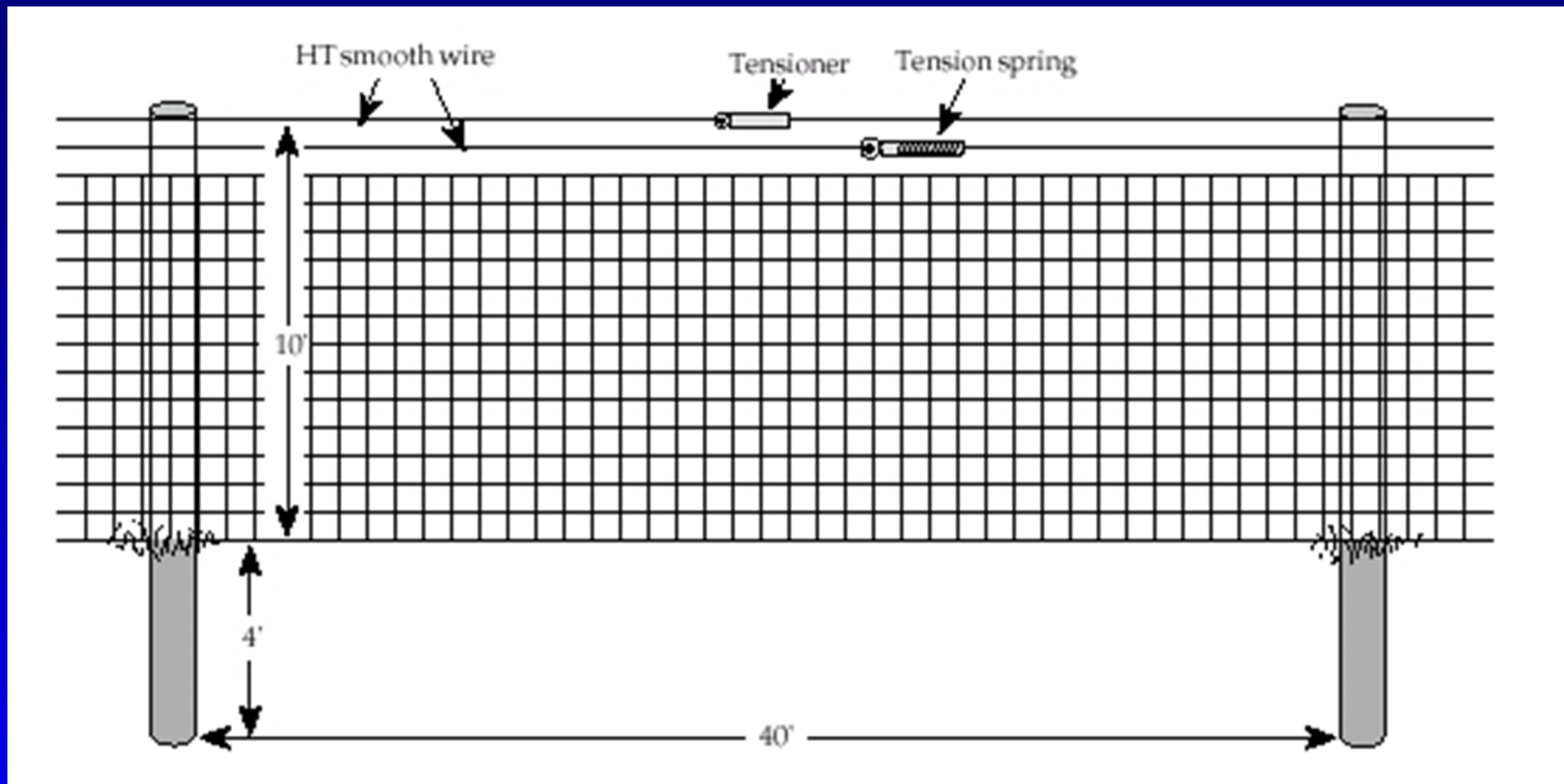
- Exclusion

Exclusion

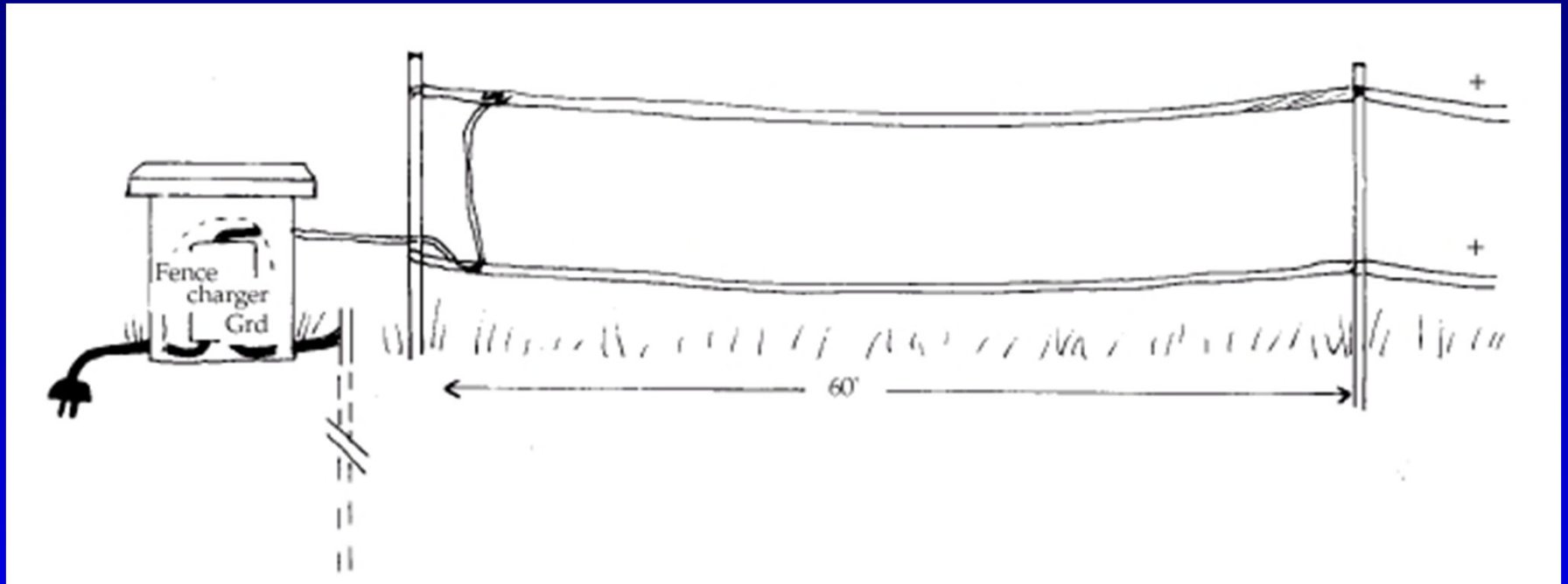
- Fences
- Plant Protectors (individual devices)



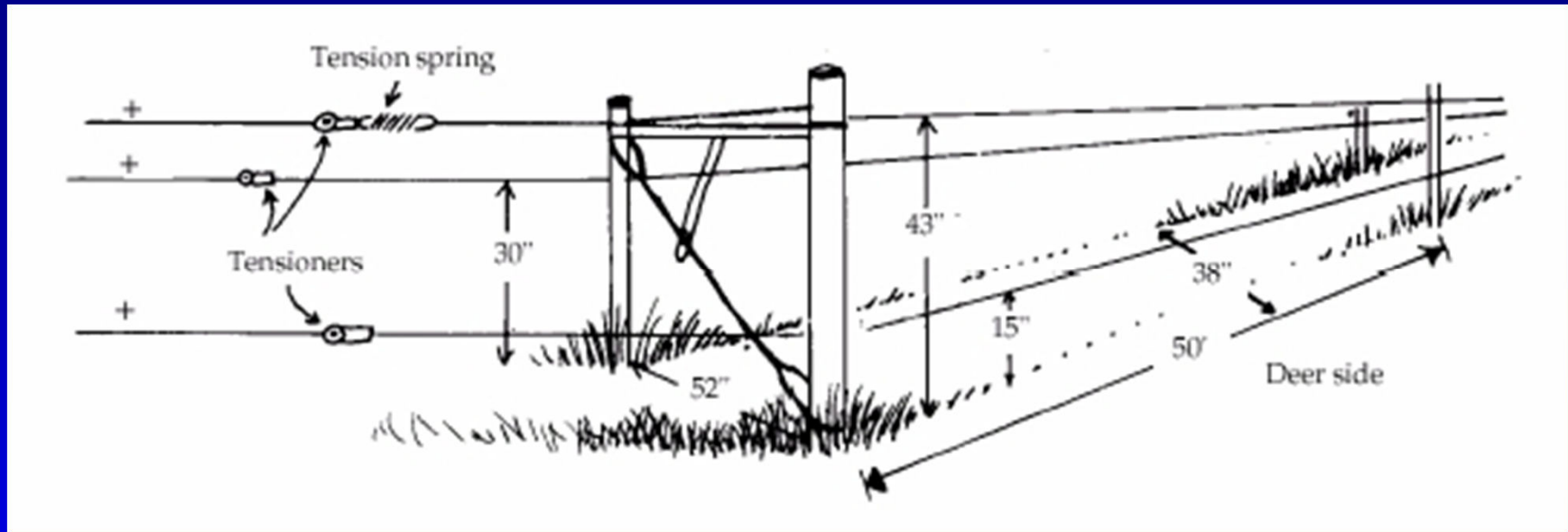
“Peanut Butter” Fence



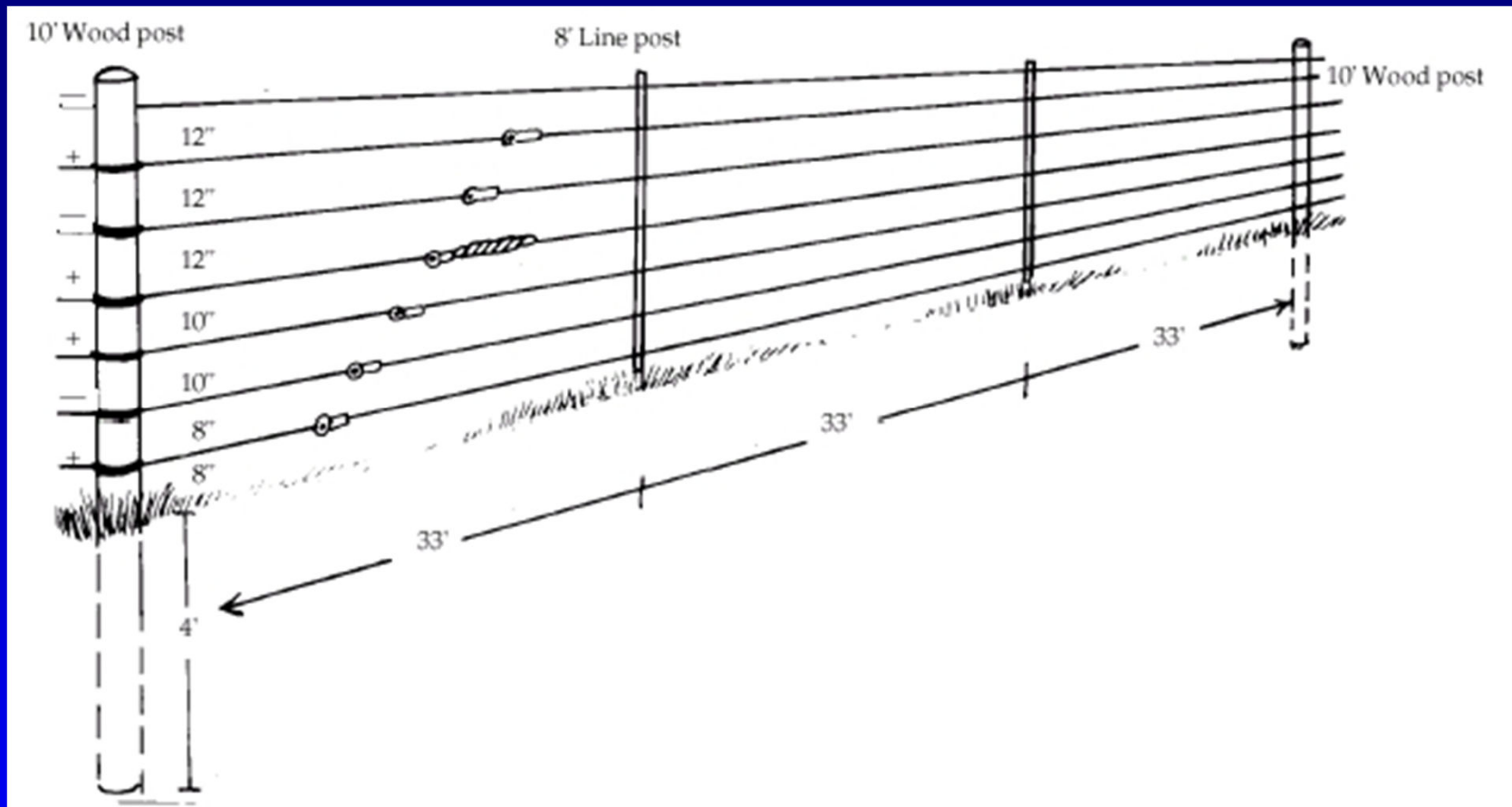
Conventional wire mesh fence



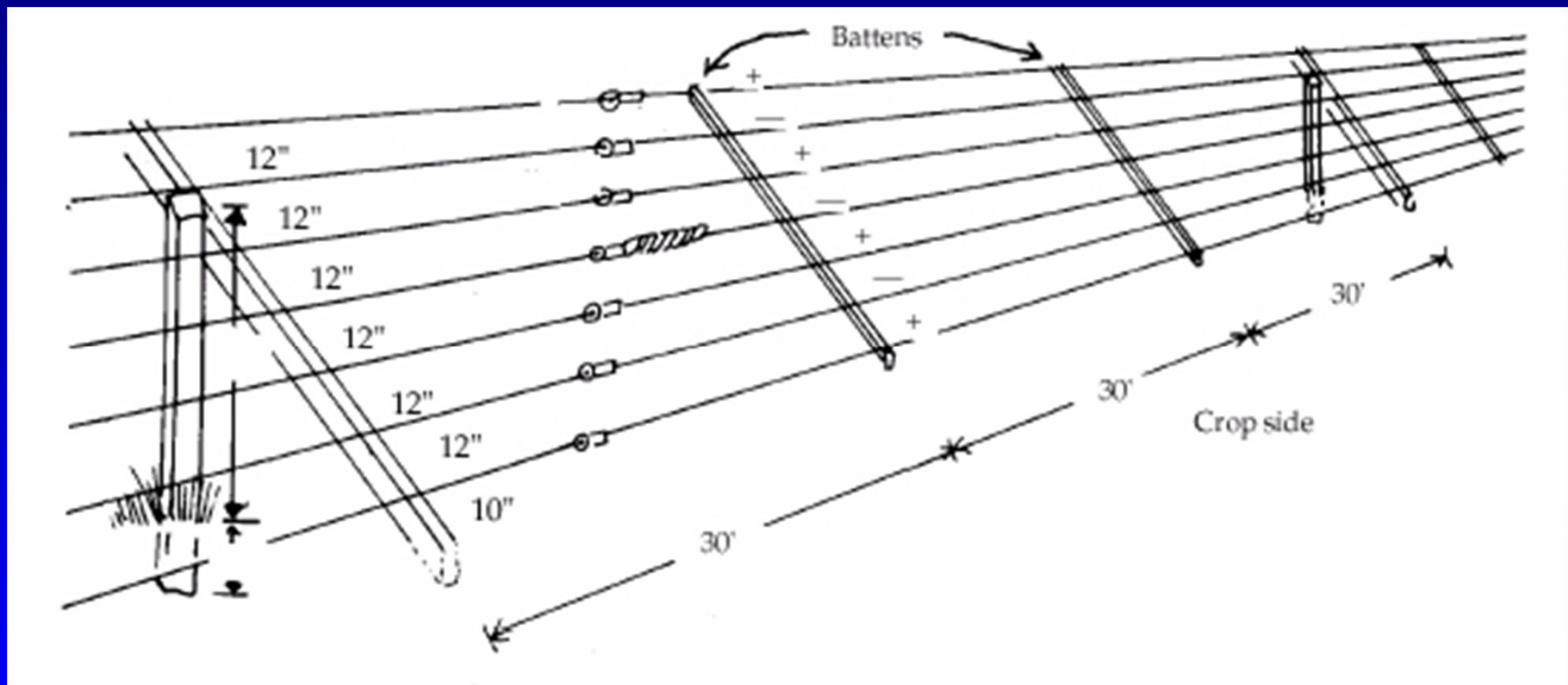
Polytape electric fence

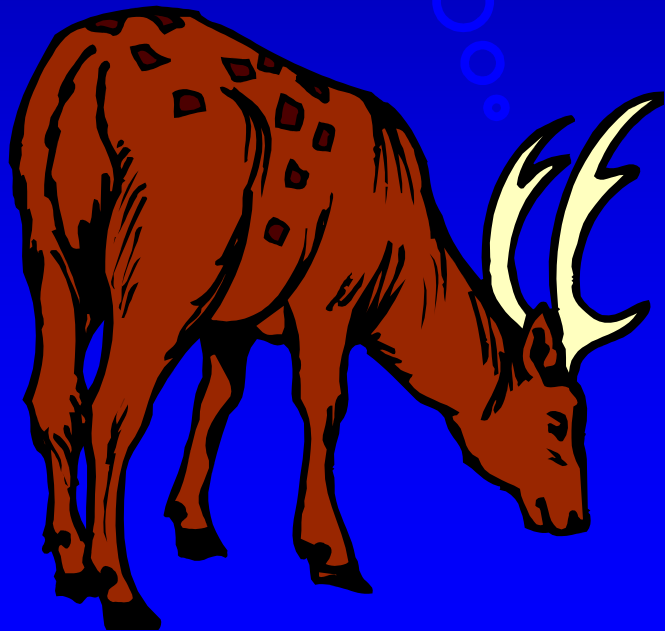

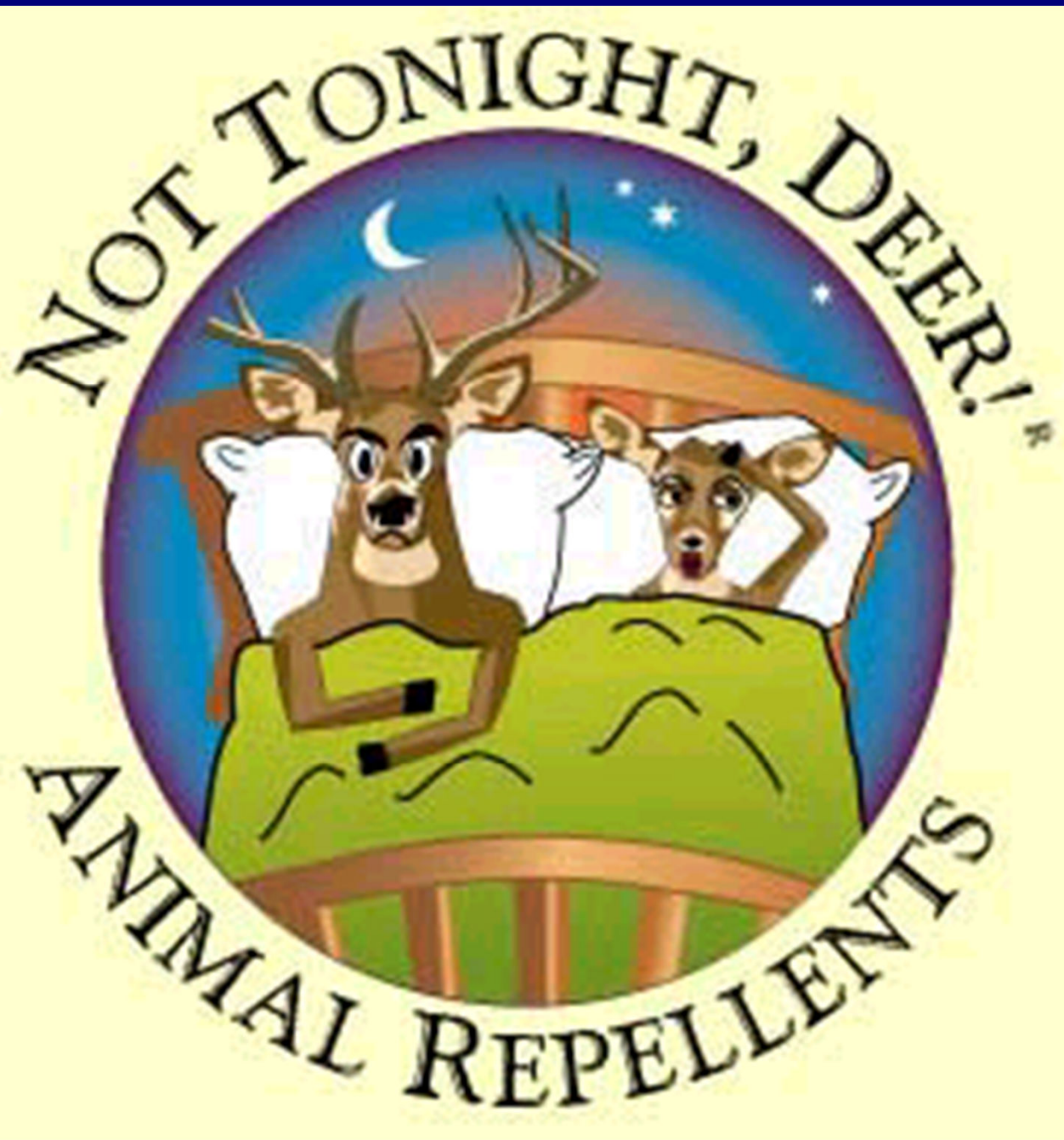
