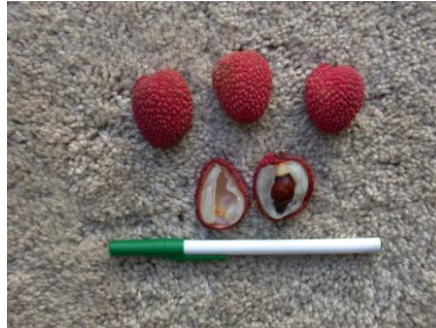




UCCE San Diego Presents:
Litchis, Longans and Carambolas



Periodically we like to get together to discuss the possibilities of growing some of the minor subtropical and tropical fruit trees in San Diego. Why? Because we have a lot of consumers in Southern California who would like to buy these fruit, and we can grow them here if they are grown in frost-free areas. We are fortunate to have Dr. Jonathan Crane here to give a talk on these fruits. Dr. Crane is the Tropical Fruit Crop Specialist from the University of Florida, Homestead Tropical Research and Extension Center.

Litchis (lychees) are particularly attractive and I have seen quite a few trees growing here, but they just don't seem to want to set fruit very well. Perhaps Dr. Crane can give us some production tips.
