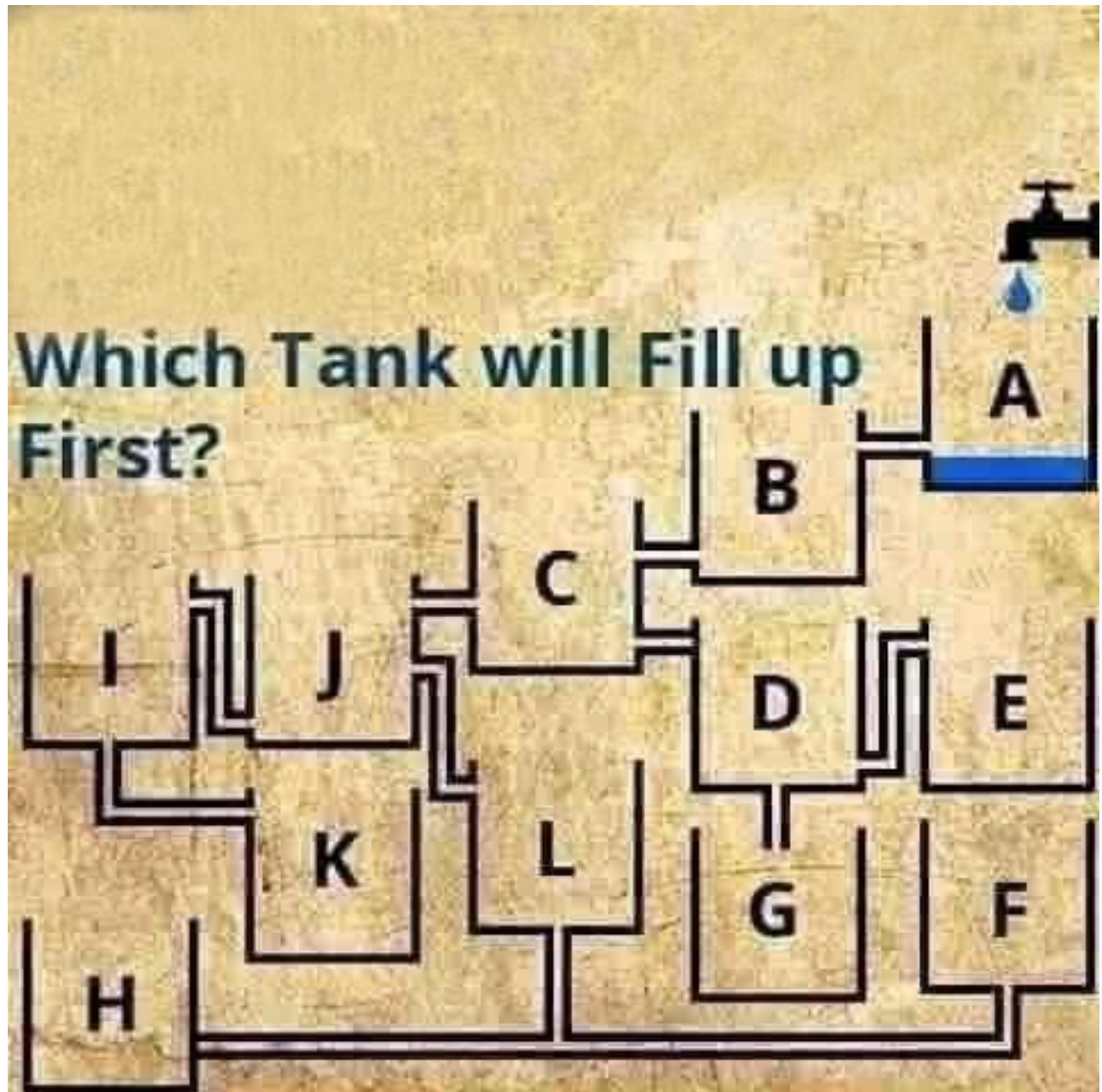

Remember, you must receive an approval from Yana for all in-person activities before engagement.

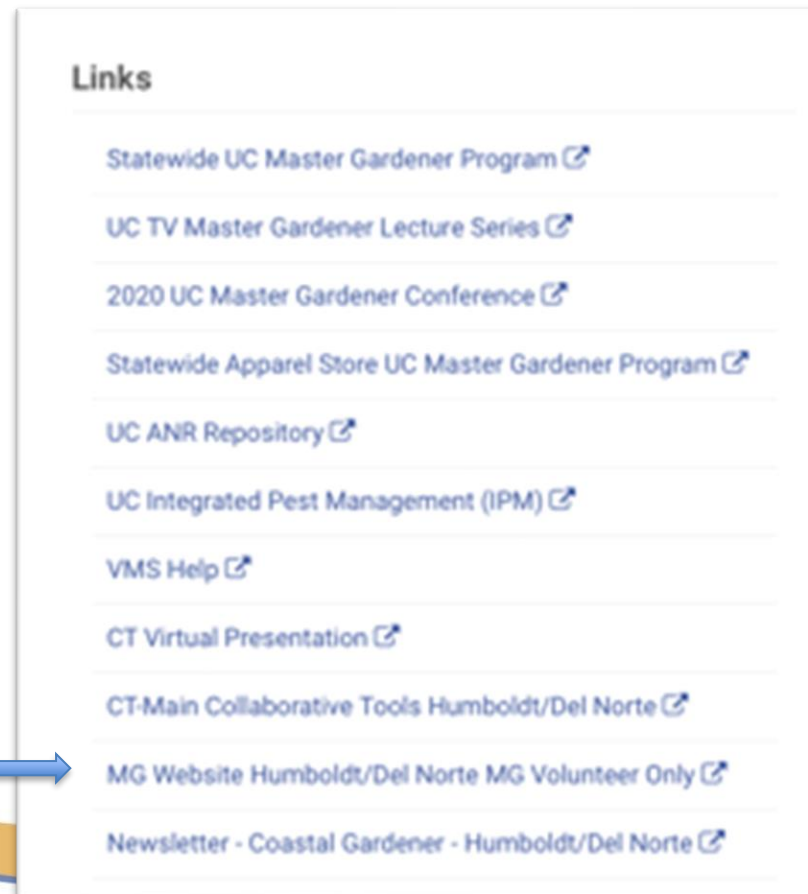
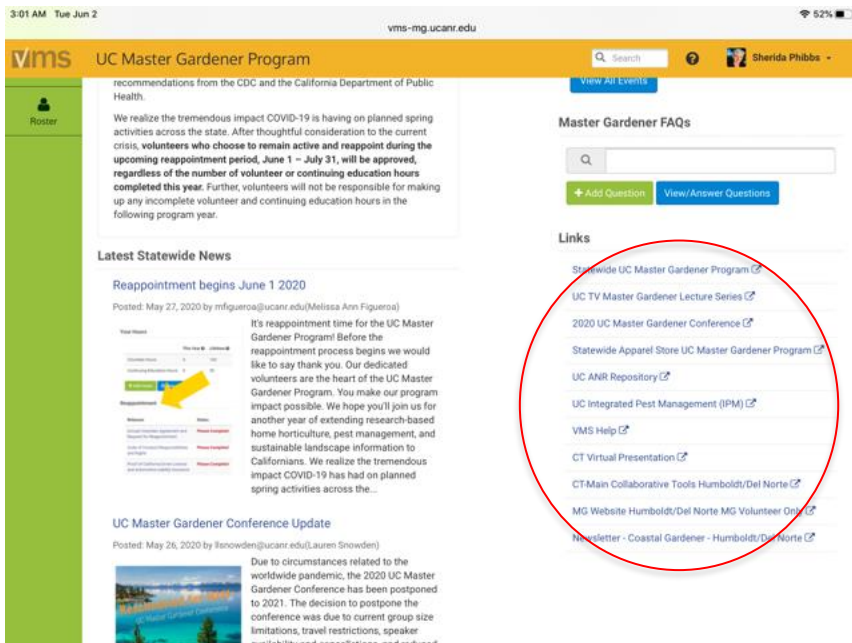

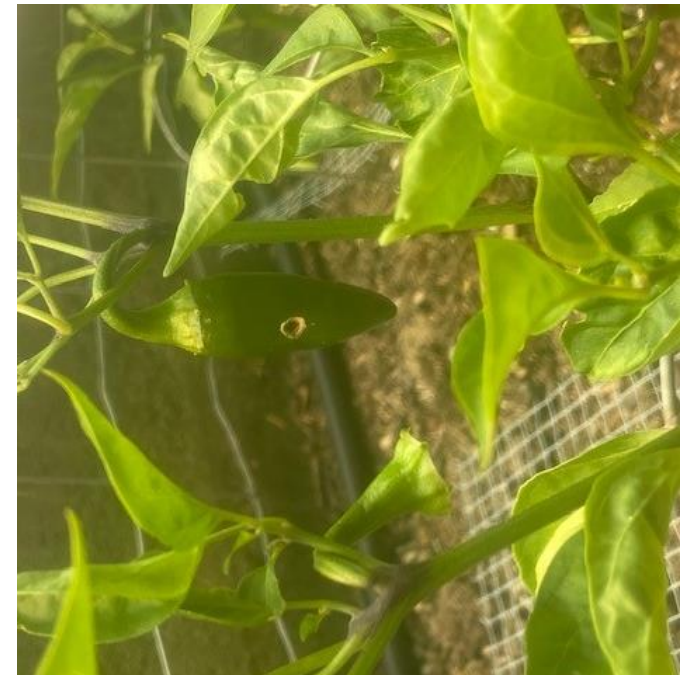
