Livestock Exhibitor Rule for Participation at a California Fair

2020 STATE RULES FOR CALIFORNIA FAIRS

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL DEPARTMENTS

II. Eligibility

Participation

12. In order to participate in a Youth livestock program (excluding horse, calves & dogs) at any California Fair, all **exhibitors 9 years of age and older must obtain annual certification** in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program or a comparable fair run program approved by the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Fairs and Expositions Branch. Those not certified are not eligible to participate at a California Fair.



How do you get certification?

YQCA Online Training Options:

Cost \$12

The online training is taken at home by each exhibitor at your convenience. Remember that fairs require the completion of the training prior to your entry into the fair. Training is good for one year from the date completed. Make sure you print and keep a copy of the completed certificate.

Fair Sponsored/Approved QA Program Option:

No Cost.

The Siskiyou Golden Fair will be hosting a “How to Get to Auction-The Right Way” educational seminar on March 19, 2020. No pre-registration required. Program starts at 6pm at Wine-ma Hall at the Siskiyou Golden Fairgrounds. **This course will fit the requirements for exhibiting at the Siskiyou Golden Fair only.**

YQCA In-Person Training: Cost \$3.00

The Tulelake-Butte Valley Fair will be hosting an in-person training on Tuesday, March 24, 2020 at the TLBV Fairgrounds.

Remember all Junior livestock exhibitors must meet this requirement not just those who wish to sell an animal.

Fashion Revue

Fashion Revue is an event for all 4-H youth. Some categories have requirements for participation in projects such as Clothing & Textiles, Quilting, and Consumer Science projects. This is an opportunity for youth to have the products which they have made evaluated by members of the sewing community. Not only do youth get evaluated, they get to show off their products to the other youth and 4-H Community during the fashion show.



The Siskiyou County Fashion Revue will be held on Saturday, April 18th at the Montague Methodist Church. The Judging portion will begin at 2:30pm and the Public Fashion show will be held at 4:30pm.

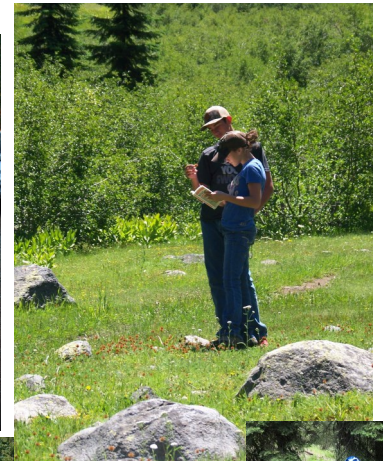
