



Placer County 4-H Youth Development Program Council Fair Committee Description

General Description

The Council Fair Committee is a volunteer serving under the direction of the Placer County 4-H Council. With support from Council and the 4-H Youth Development Program (YDP) staff, the Council Fair Committee serves as the liaison with the fair(s). The Council Fair Committee is responsible for connecting and communicating with the Gold Country and Placer County Fairs and communicating all information with Council.

Working with Council and the 4-H YDP staff, the Fair Committee will coordinate the Still Exhibit Hall volunteer schedules for both fairs.

Events coordinated by the Fair Committee include:

- Gold County Fair
- Placer County Fair

Fair Committee Responsibilities:

The Fair Committee will work closely with the Placer County 4-H YDP Staff and Placer County 4-H Council to:

- Communicate with fairs in regards to information about Junior Livestock Auction such as important fair dates, weigh in, in-kind work etc.
- Share updated information from fairs with Council and 4-H YDP staff
- Facilitate the animal to be raised for the Council Scholarship Animal
- Organize, plan and facilitate the record keeping of buyers of the Council Scholarship Animal
- Provide fair with binder of Project Completion Sheets.
- Coordinate and organize the Still Exhibit Hall volunteer schedule
- Collect tickets for entry to fair for those working the Still Exhibits Hall and work with 4-H YDP staff to distribute accordingly.

Term of Appointment

The Fair Committee shall serve a one-year term with eligibility to apply for reappointment to another term.
