Job Description**

General Description

The 4-H Council Youth Officer works to support the Council Chair and Vice Chair in providing leadership, guidance and coordination of the 4-H Council of the Placer County 4-H Youth Development Program (YDP).

Specific Responsibilities

- Follow and abide by the Placer County 4-H Council Youth Officer Job Description.
- Provide insight about the 4-H program from a youth perspective.
- Share ideas about youth support and activities.
- Work closely with the 4-H YDP and Office staff.
- Become familiar with parliamentary procedures and consensus methods of making decisions.

Time Involved

The time needed to do the job varies throughout the year. It is estimated that on average 5-7 hours per month throughout the year would be required to do this job well.

Term of Appointment

The Council Youth Officer shall serve a one-year term, with eligibility for reappointment to another one-year term. There must be at least a two-year period after the second term before reappointment can be made to the same position. Applicants will go through an application and selection process led by a selection committee.
