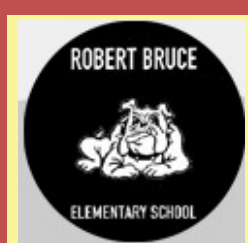


UCCE Youth, Families, & Communities Program & Robert Bruce Elementary

2015/16 Program Report – Nutrition Education & Youth Development

This report shares the outcomes of the partnership between the UCCE Youth, Families, & Communities (YFC) Program and Robert Bruce Elementary School in Santa Maria, CA during the 15/16 academic year.



975 students were enrolled in AY 15/16, including 79.5% English Language Learners, 97.6% qualifying for free or reduced price meals, and 7.8% with disabilities.

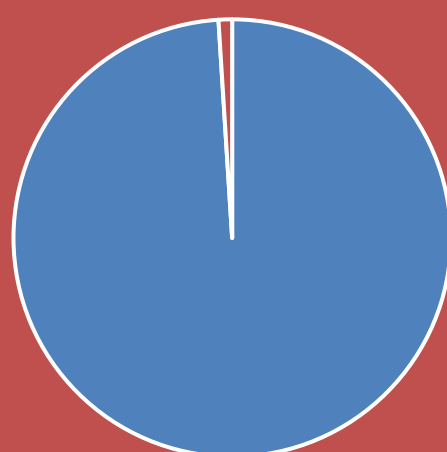

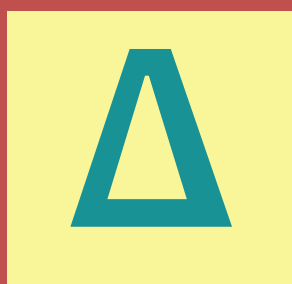
