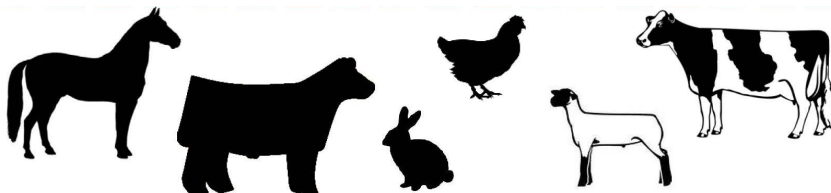

The Spring Fair emphasizes showmanship practice.
No market/prospect classes will be offered.

NO LIMIT OF SPECIES A MEMBER CAN ENTER

Showmanship Information

- **Registration fee \$10** per species entered. **Payment due** day of event.
- Members may compete in **unlimited** Showmanship events. Show times may vary. If doing multiple animals, please watch the schedule closely for show times. 4-H project required for showmanship classes.
- **Novice** Livestock showmanship is defined as a “member who has **NEVER** shown in **THAT** type of animal as a regular member (beef, sheep, swine, goat, dog, rabbit, pygmy goat) showmanship class in a county, district, regional or state fair.” Spring Fair, local club events, and years showing as a primary member do not count.
- Members must be present at the time the judge calls for a class to begin. They expect promptness.

General Information

- Animals should arrive “show ready”.
- All classes of livestock must be ready for judging at **9:45 am**. Judging will start at **10:00 am**.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and watering equipment while at the Spring Fair. The owner of each animal is responsible for the feeding, watering, and care of the animal. Please be sure your animal has an adequate amount of water available.
- Do not bring bedding for the animals.
- Clean stalls are a must. All litter must be removed (taken home) before your animal may leave the grounds.
- Unmanageable animals will not be allowed to show and may be asked to leave. Beef cattle must be trained to lead.
- Livestock scales will be open for use.
- Dogs not entered in the dog class are not allowed. No dogs are allowed in the livestock area.
- All disqualified animals must be removed from the grounds.

Divisions and Classes

PLEASE NOTE:

- Exhibitor's age determined as of Dec 31, 2018.
- **Showmanship judging** will take place in the following order for each individual animal category (classes will not be held for late arrivals):
 1. **Senior:** 14 & older
 2. **Junior:** 9 - 13 yrs old
 3. **Novice:** member who has never shown that type of animal (as a regular member)
 4. **Primary:** 5 - 8 yrs old

SHOWMANSHIP DIVISIONS:

Primary Members may enter the following Livestock Divisions:

* RABBIT *DOG SHOWMANSHIP *PYGMY GOAT

Junior and Senior Members may enter the following small and large animal Livestock Divisions:

*GOAT *SWINE *SHEEP *HORSE

4-H horse showmanship rules :

- Mounted riders must wear helmets
- Helmets are not required (but recommended) for showmanship classes



Still Exhibits

Entry Instructions:

- \$10 entry fee - no max of still exhibits
- **All entries** exhibited must have been made by the 4-H member as part of their 4-H project work for the 2018-2019 program year.
- **All still exhibit entries** must be checked-in by 9:00 am on Saturday, May 18th

Awards

- ALL Still Exhibits, (9 yrs old/junior member and above) will receive a ribbon award.
- The Danish System of Judging will be used with 1st—5th place ribbons awarded.
- A Still Exhibits Sweepstakes and Reserve Sweepstakes award will be awarded to the 4-H'er with the greatest number of points from exhibits. Point values will be assigned based on ribbon awarded (ex. blue ribbon = 3 points, red ribbon = 2 points, etc.).
- Primary Members will receive participation ribbons.

Cake Decorating

- Cake's base not to exceed 14" overall. Cake must be on a Styrofoam or other base that simulates a cake. Cupcakes should be decorated on a real base.

Foods

- Wrapping instructions: Please use paper plates for exhibiting all food products. Cover with clear plastic (sealed bag or plastic wrap).
- Quantity to bring:
 - Muffins, biscuits, rolls, cookies, candies=1/2 dozen, plus 1 individually wrapped
 - Cakes=1/2 cake, plus 1 slice
 - Bread=1/2 loaf, plus 1 slice
 - Pie=whole pie
- For food safety reasons, please no custards, cheesecakes, or pumpkin pies.
