# It's time to enroll in 4-H for the 2025-2026 Program year! All Youth & Adults - It's Time To Re-Enroll

Enroll online at: https://4h.zsuite.org/, or by visiting the UCCE Office located at 821 E. South St., Orland.

Enroll for the 2025-2026 4-H year by Monday, September 15, 2025, and you will receive free 4-H swag and your name will be entered into the early bird drawing for a 2026 Glenn County Fair all-day ride Early Bird Special pass bracelet. Three lucky names will be drawn. Leaders also have an opportunity to be included in a drawing for one of three door prizes if they have completed all the leader steps by Monday, September 15, 2025.

Youth enrollment fees are \$70.00 if enrolled by Monday, September 15, 2025. Youth member fees will increase to \$80.00 per enrollment after this date. The Glenn County 4-H Fair Exhibition Enrollment Deadline is Monday, November 3, 2025.



Enrollment fees can be paid at the UCCE Office with cash or check. Please make checks payable to the Glenn County 4-H. #### **NEW ADULT VOLUNTEER'S ENROLLMENT PROCESS**

As a volunteer, you will play an important role in the development of young people, helping them to identify their spark and develop the skills and positive outcomes that lead to thriving. Below are the steps to becoming a new volunteer (Scan the QR Code to access these details with clickable links):



- Step #1: Fill out the 4-H Adult Volunteer Interest Survey online at: <a href="https://forms.gle/ps1jddBhU33E4QVd8">https://forms.gle/ps1jddBhU33E4QVd8</a>.
- Step #2: Submit the 4-H Adult Volunteer application packet to the UCCE Office or
  process online enrollment at: <a href="https://4h.zsuite.org/">https://4h.zsuite.org/</a>. The ZSuite system recommends using Chrome or
  Firefox browsers. Create a profile, enter all required information, and submit. Adult Volunteer enrollment
  status will show as pending until all steps listed below are completed and approved by office staff.
- Step #3: Complete the required "2025-2026 California New Volunteer Course" in Campus Extension.
   \*Go to: <a href="https://campus.extension.org/enrol/index.php?id=2718">https://campus.extension.org/enrol/index.php?id=2718</a> and create an account. It is a approximately 1.5 hours long and can be done in multiple sessions. The Glenn County Volunteer Enrollment Key is "Glenn". An in person opportunity is also listed below.
- Step #4: Complete your DOJ/FBI Live Scan Request with the State Department of Justice. You will need to bring the "Glenn County 4-H Request for Live Scan Service" form with you. Once you complete the 4-H Adult Volunteer Interest Survey Online, you can obtain the detailed letter and form by email or in person.
- **Step #5:** The Community Education Specialist and the Regional Program Coordinator review the application. A letter will be sent from the Community Education Specialist with approval status and appointment card, limitations of the appointment, or a letter of non-approval.

### RETURNING ADULT VOLUNTEER ENROLLMENT PROCESS

Thank you for your interest in continuing as a 4-H Adult Volunteer and your dedication to the Glenn County 4-H Program. Below are the steps to becoming a new volunteer:

- Step #1: Submit the 4-H adult volunteer application packet to UCCE Office or process online enrollment at: <a href="https://4h.zsuite.org/">https://4h.zsuite.org/</a>.
- Step #2: Complete required "2025-2026 4-H California Returning Volunteer Course" in Campus Extension\* Go to: <a href="https://campus.extension.org/course/view.php?id=2380">https://campus.extension.org/course/view.php?id=2380</a>. (approx. 50 minutes) An in person opportunity is also listed below.
- **Step #3:** The Community Education Specialist and the Regional Program Coordinator review the application. A letter will be sent from the Community Education Specialist with approval status and appointment card, limitations of the appointment, or a letter of non-approval.



### Failure to Re-apply as a 4-H Adult Volunteer (Break in Service)

California 4-H Policy Reminder
4-H adult volunteers must reapply annually
to maintain active status. If a volunteer does
not complete the re-enrollment process for
the new program year, it is considered a
break in service, and they may not serve in
any volunteer role until they have
completed all necessary steps.

Each year, by July 31, 4-H staff are required to submit the names and birthdates of individuals who did not reapply to the UC ANR Office of Risk Services and the California Department of Justice (DOJ).

### CAMPUS EXTENSION TRAININGS OFFERED IN-PERSON

To meet the requirements of the University of California, and the 4-H Youth Development Program, all volunteers are required to complete annual trainings related to positive youth development, cultural competency, and 4-H policy.

These required trainings can be completed at your own pace online, or in person, but must be completed in order to become an approved 4-H Adult Volunteer. There are also three opportunities to complete the trainings in person if you prefer a group setting or need support. This simple planning document helps outline your goals, meeting topics, and activities—ensuring a well-rounded and engaging experience for members. It also supports positive youth development by incorporating hands-on learning, goal setting, and reflection.

#### 4-H POLICY REMINDER

When planning 4-H events and activities, the expectation is that a minimum of two approved 4-H Adult Volunteers are present at all times. In rare cases where an appointed volunteer has an urgent matter and it becomes impractical or impossible to meet this requirement, staff may coordinate and designate another adult—who must be at least 21 years old—to serve in this role.



The use of a non-appointed adult should only occur as a last resort and is not intended to be a standard practice when planning 4-H events or activities.

Instructor Training Workshops are for those interested in becoming certified for the specific discipline. Upon successful workshop completion, 4-H Adult Volunteers will be certified as an Instructor, enabling them to lead a project in that specific discipline. Teen Leaders (high school aged 4-H members) are eligible to participate if there is an adult leader in their home county they will be assisting.




### NATIONAL 4-H WEEK HELD OCTOBER 5-11, 2025: BEYOND READY

#### **Purpose:**

This document outlines the Glenn County 4-H Fair Exhibition Requirements for 4-H Youth Members to Exhibit Livestock/Animals and ABA (Anything but Animals) projects at the Glenn County Fair for the 2025-2026 program year. All requirements listed align with the 4-H Steps to Success policy and FAQ. Please complete the Agreement Form on the back, and submit it with signatures, to the UCCE Office by **Monday, April 13, 2026**.

#### **Primary Members:**

- 1. Meet the requirements and rules set by the Glenn County Fair.
- 2. **Be a member in good standing as outlined in the 4-H Steps to Success.** You must complete the 4-H enrollment process and be enrolled in the project(s) intended to exhibit at the Glenn County Fair by the Fair Exhibition Enrollment deadline on **Monday, November 3, 2025**.

#### Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Members:

- 1. Be a Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Member, and be 9 years old by December 31st of the program year.
- 2. Meet requirements and rules set by the Glenn County Fair.
- 3. **Be a member in good standing as outlined in the 4-H Steps to Success.** You must complete the 4-H enrollment process and be enrolled in the project(s) intended to exhibit at the Glenn County Fair by the Fair Exhibition Enrollment Deadline on **Monday, November 3, 2025**.
  - Enrollment is considered complete when submitted through the CA 4-H Enrollment System ZSuites, or a hard copy enrollment application is submitted to the UCCE Office. Additionally, enrollment fees must be paid by credit card, cash, check, or a submitted Fee Waiver to the UCCE Office.
- 4. **Project Completion** Complete a minimum of six hours of 4-H project instruction, or more, as required by the project leader by the fair entry deadline. For minimum requirements for project completion, refer to the Project Leader 4-H Annual Project Plan provided by your Project Leader.
  - The project leader will communicate the project meeting schedule and hours required to all members by the first meeting. In some instances, the Project Leader may need to divide the project into separate groups due to project levels or due to an increase in project enrollment. This is up to the Project Leaders discretion.
- 5. **Project Presentation** Give a presentation related to the project you are exhibiting at the Glenn County Fair. If a member will be exhibiting an ABA project as well as a livestock project, the member can choose a presentation for either project.
  - Give a presentation at County Presentation Day, a Club Meeting, a Project Meeting, a qualifying county event, service clubs, school classrooms, senior citizens groups, etc. (Presentations given to neighbors, relatives, or friends DO NOT count.) Please reference, complete, and submit the Presentation Form if you are not giving your presentation at County Presentation Day.
- 6. **APR Form** Returning members must submit an Annual Project Report (APR) Form for all projects exhibited by the previous program year by the due date set by the county. New and returning members exhibiting at the fair, are required to submit an APR Form at the end of the current program year on the due date set by the county if exhibiting next year. This will be verified at the end of the previous program year.
