
2025 Steakfry Orange County Farm Bureau's Annual Fundraising Dinner

Research Spotlight



This is how the organic waste arrives at the center. Since it's

May 4-10 is International Compost Awareness Week!

Compost is so important it has its own week dedicated to it! May 4 through 10, 2025 is **International Compost Awareness Week**. The theme for this year is "Sustainable Communities Begin with Compost!"

Natalie Levy, our Soil Health and Organic Materials Management Advisor, had the opportunity to visit the Otay Landfill to learn about their sustainability initatives that include

bagged up, the bags need to be separated from the waste.



This is THOR, the machine that separates the organic slurry from the bags that the organic waste is transported in.



These are aerated static piles where the organic slurry will be added for composting after it has been separated from the bags. The piles are covered with Gore-Tex fabric, also known as a GORE® Cover system. It is a method that uses a breathable, waterproof fabric to cover the compost pile while introducing air through a plenum system. This system allows for controlled aeration and moisture management, reducing odors and other emissions. The Gore-Tex fabric allows gases like oxygen and carbon dioxide to move through, while also

organics recycling from residential curbside pick up as well as food waste from commercial customers.

To better address issues around sorting commercial food waste, this facility recently added a de-packaging and separation system (THOR) that can process 20 tons of organic waste per hour from bagged or packaged waste. This type of equipment can be used to scale up the goals of organic waste diversion from restaurants, schools, and large venues/sports arenas.

Urban Agriculture Technology Advisor for Los Angeles and Orange Counties

Hi, I'm Grant Johnson, Urban Agriculture Technology Advisor for Los Angeles and Orange Counties! I've been with UC ANR for 8 years — 2 years in my current role and 6 years before that as a Staff Research Associate at SCREC. Time flies by! I left for grad school for a bit, but I always had my sights on becoming an advisor — proof that surrounding yourself with great mentors can make all the difference.



What does a "typical" day look like for you?

No two days are the same, although they all start with a cup of coffee. One day I'm setting up field trials and troubleshooting irrigation systems; the next, I'm keeping tabs on new ag technologies or chasing down funding opportunities nonstop. It's a mix of tech experiments, fieldwork, grower visits, and a permanent farmer's tan. Every day brings a new puzzle to solve, and there's a certain rhythm where everything seems to ramp up all at once.

What part of your work are you most excited about or proud of right now?

Right now, I'm especially excited about projects bringing new technology into urban agriculture, particularly for small urban farms. It's inspiring to see the excitement and heart that plant people share and propagate to each other. Merging solar power and plant shading is a current highlight, and I'm excited to begin plant trials soon. If you have crops that love shade, why not generate electricity at the same time? Many growers are incredibly crafty, and if there's a solution that works, I want to help bring that innovation to their attention and make a difference for urban growers.

What's your favorite fruit/vegetable we grow at SCREC?

You better believe I'm checking the vegetable bins daily! There are some wonderful work perks, and they're all thanks to the amazing volunteers and programs growing seasonal produce. I've discovered that mini avocados are just as delicious as they are adorable. And if you're ever lucky enough to "beefriend" the OC Bee Team, a jar of their honey is worth its weight in gold.

I like to challenge myself each season to cook with something new. Okra ended up in the vegetable bin and was my biggest surprise — I wasn't sure what to expect, but after learning a few great recipes, it quickly earned a spot on my favorites list. We'll see what new contenders pop up this year!
