South Coast REC



UCCE Orange County



UC South Coast Research and Extension Center (REC) sits on nearly 200 acres of land in Irvine, California. Since 1956, South Coast REC has served as a research station for projects relating to agriculture and natural resources. There is a rich history of <u>research</u> on water resources, ornamental and landscape plants, plant breeding, and variety trials for crops like strawberries, pitahaya, and avocados. We still grow some of these varieties today including 65 varieties of persimmons, varieties of cherimoyas, and 147 varieties of citrus.

Aside from research, we also serve as a hub for <u>agriculture education</u> and <u>outreach</u> for the local community. We have a strong partnership with the Orange County Farm Bureau and for several decades have provided hands-on agriculture education to the youth of Orange County through the GROW Program.



South Coast REC-ipes: delicious dishes made with SCREC-grown produce

Roasted Sweet Potatoes and Cauliflower

Ingredients:

- Cauliflower
- Sweet Potatoes
- Olive Oil
- Salt
- Pepper
- Garlic Powder
- Dried chopped basil
- Dried chopped oregano

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 450F.
- Wash and peel the sweet potatoes, then slice long ways into French fry size pieces. Wash and cut the cauliflower into desired size.
- Toss the cut veggies in olive oil, salt, pepper, garlic powder, basil, and oregano.
- Bake for 20-25 minutes, or until desired texture. Enjoy!
