The event brought together farmers, ranchers, artisan vendors, chefs, food-lovers, and more for a weekend filled with delicious food and drink tastings, educational panels, interactive demonstrations, music, and fun!

Research Spotlight

Biodegradable Mulches for a Greener Future

A recent UC Cooperative Extension San Bernardino County study in compared biodegradable and organic mulches with traditional plastic film in hillside strawberry production. Trials with the cultivars 'Albion' and 'Portola' showed that coconut liner and biodegradable plastic mulch produced 33-38% higher yields than bare soil, while black plastic and paper mulch performed similarly to the control. Importantly, fruit quality (size and sweetness) did not differ by mulch type, though 'Albion' consistently had higher sugar levels than 'Portola'. These findings suggest that biodegradable mulches can provide a sustainable alternative to plastic film, improving yield while reducing plastic waste in small-scale strawberry farming.





Urban Watershed Resilience: California Water Plan

Do you know potable reuse now serves nearly a million in OC? California's 2023 Water Plan (CWP-2023) shows how wins like that can scale; three pillars (climate urgency, watershed resilience, equity) and seven case studies proving it

works: LA County's countywide roadmap, OC's GWRS (130 MGD), Pure Water San Diego (~50% local by 2035), Santa Clara Valley Water's purified supply and recharge, Sacramento's Harvest Water (50,000 AFY), SAWPA's OWOW, and FIRO on the Russian River.

Why it matters: less reliance on imports, stronger local supplies, cleaner waterways, and nature-based solutions that double as green infrastructure. We also share the "how": crosswalk your plans to CWP-2023, set measurable targets, launch early pilots (reuse, stormwater, recharge, NbS), and report progress publicly; now turbocharged by new DPR rules and DWR's Watershed Resilience Initiative.

UC Landscape Plant Irrigation Trials Fall Open House

UC Landscape Plant Irrigation Trials™ South Coast REC FALL 2025 Open House

Who should attend? Professionals from Landscape, Horticulture, and related fields; City Planners/Urban Designers; UC Master Gardeners; Water Conservationists; Academics/Educators; Garden Writers.

What's involved: Evaluating aesthetic qualities of selected plants (takes ~60 mins)

When: Tuesday, October 28th between 8:00 am and 12:00 pm

About the event: Join us for the second Open House of the 2025 <u>Climate Ready Vines</u> trial. Participants will assess the impact of different levels of irrigation on vine plant performance following the summer heat. After a short introduction to the rubric, participants will evaluate the aesthetic qualities of selected plants independently at their own pace. We will provide a clipboard, rating sheet & pen. Sturdy, comfortable shoes, sunscreen and/or a hat are suggested as the field is uneven mulch/packed dirt in full sun. Carpooling is encouraged but not required. Cold water will be provided.

About the Project: UCLPIT™ seeks to improve urban water-use efficiency and develop irrigation recommendations by evaluating landscape plant performance on three irrigation treatments that correspond to the Water Use Classification of Landscape Species (WUCOLS) High, Moderate, and Low categories of water need.
