Shasta County 4-H Ambassador is going to the National 4-H Conference !

Each Spring the National 4-H Conference brings hundred of 4-H'ers to Washington D.C. These members have the opportunity to network with 4-H'ers from around the world. The working conference allows youth & adults to assist with the development of recommendations for the 4-H Youth Development Program. California selects only 6 delegates to attend each year, and Marianna from Hat Creek 4-H is one of them!

In preparation for, during & after the National 4-H Conference, youth members learn, practice, and apply new skills and use their voices, talent, and ideas to make a difference. The delegates meet with Congress and the Senate to make legislators aware of the tremendous impact of the 4-H program.

During her 12 years in 4-H, Marianna has been a club officer, has served multiple years serving as junior & teen project leaders, and is now in her 2nd year as a County Ambassador. Marianna will graduate from high school in June, 2027 and will graduate in May, 2027 with a double Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Sciences - along with an Associates for Transfer in Psychology.



Inter-Mountain Home Ec & Ag Stills Day 2026

General Guidelines

1. All exhibits must have been made by the 4-H member during the current 4-H year and under the supervision of a certified 4-H leader. To participate in this event, member must be enrolled in the project to exhibit items.
2. The 4-H member is responsible for meeting check-in times. Late exhibits will not be judged.
3. The judges' decisions are final. All judges are volunteers and offer their expertise in evaluating 4-H project work. Respect should be given to those recruited as judges.
4. A successful 4-H Still Exhibits Fair takes the involvement of every 4-H member, leader and parent with lots of help from our 4-H friends! If you have any questions or would like to volunteer to help with this event, please contact the office at (530) 224-4900.



AWARDS: Danish system of judging (blue, red and white ribbons) will be used. Medals awarded to top scoring entry in each category, for each division. Primary participants will receive one participation pin. Entries will not be released until awards ceremony is completed.

PLEASE NOTE: **NO** members, adult leaders or parents will be allowed in the competition area until all judging is completed. Leaders and parents are to help fill out any required paperwork in advance of dropping items off. Allow enough time if you have entries in more than one category.



Local 4-H

Burney 4-H member selected to participate in National FCS Fashion Revue

The 4-H Family and Consumer Science (FCS) National Conference provides 4-H members with the opportunity to compete on a national stage against their peers from across the U.S. The 4-H FCS National Conference is where Senior winners in the Traditional, Consumer Science Purchased, and Uniquely Upcycled categories from each State compete in a National Fashion Revue competition. Held in January, California can send a maximum of six youth. Nicole from Burney 4-H qualified and was selected to participate in Fashion Revue Nationals in January, 2026 !

Entrants worked together on a "Quilt of Valor" service project while at the event in Texas. Four of the girls in the CA group - including Nicole - competed in a "Consumer Decision Making" competition. This is similar to livestock judging, but using products and consumer scenarios. California 4-H has never competed before because this isn't offered in our State categories. Four CA members volunteered to be guinea pigs. There was 104 pages of information to review! They took the position that they probably wouldn't place, but would learn a lot. There were 14 teams and CA took 5th in 2 of the categories :)

Nicole did not Place in the Consumer Purchase category at Nationals, but we are so proud of her efforts. Nicole started out a few years ago as a kid who did not like crowds or public speaking. Thanks to involvement in 4-H she has become a confident young lady. Her goal this year is to win in a different category and go back to Nationals!

Who Can Enter the 2026 State Fashion Revue?

Any Junior, Intermediate or Senior 4-H Member.

Traditional, Consumer Science Purchased & Uniquely Upcycled must have received County Winner at a County 4-H Fashion Revue or other qualifying event. Only one County Winner from each age division in these three categories may enter in the same State Fashion Revue category.

The other categories do not need to qualify at a County 4-H or other qualifying event to enter.

Members may enter up to two categories at State Fashion Revue.


