WHAT IS A 4-H COMMUNITY CLUB?

An organized group of youth members, supervised by a team of appointed 4-H adult volunteers, with a planned program that is carried out through all or most of the year. 4-H clubs usually meet regularly in the evenings or on weekends and offer multiple self-chosen project learning experiences and activities.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

Clubs generally start in September or October and go until May or June. Club meetings generally occur monthly and last approximately 1 hour. Projects require a minimum of 6 hours of instruction time.

WHAT IS A CLUB MEETING?

Often led by elected youth officers, club meetings are a place for members to get to know one another, share experiences and ideas, make plans and conduct club business, learn, and have fun.

WHAT IS A PROJECT MEETING?

Members choose to learn within “projects”, led by adult volunteers. Project meetings are held separately from club meetings and teach hands-on skills in specific topic areas. Members are able to participate in project meetings offered by other clubs, if the project is listed as “countywide” or special approval has been given by the leader.

WHAT AGE YOUTH CAN JOIN?

Youth must be from 5 to 18 years old as of December 31, 2026 to participate. Visit the [Kings County 4-H Website](#) for enrollment information.

CAN YOUTH SIGN UP FOR ANY PROJECT?

For safety reasons, certain projects are not approved for 4-H Primary Member (ages 5-8) participation. These include large livestock projects, shooting sports, and additional categories outlined in the [California 4-H Project List](#).

WHAT IS A COUNTYWIDE PROJECT?

Countywide projects are open to members of any Kings County 4-H club. If the project is not based out of your primary club, add a “Secondary Unit” on your enrollment and select the project. You do not need to attend the secondary club’s meetings, only the countywide project meetings that you wish to participate in.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO JOIN 4-H?

Enrollment Fee: None, it is free to join this year - thanks to the Kings County 4-H Sponsoring Committee for paying the 2026-2027 enrollment fees for all Kings County 4-H youth members and adult volunteers!

Project Fee: Each child may be asked to acquire specific materials needed to carry out a project activity, or additional fees may be requested for some projects.
